

Marriage, Thanksgiving for the Gift of a Child and Holy Baptism

MARRIAGE AND THANKSGIVING FOR THE GIFT OF A CHILD

There are occasions when couples seeking marriage in church already have children, and might therefore wish to recognize and give thanks for God's gift of children within the context of the celebration of their marriage.

In such cases, it might be appropriate for elements of the service of Thanksgiving for the Gift of a Child to follow the Marriage. The guidelines below show how this might be done.

MARRIAGE AND HOLY BAPTISM

In some of those instances where couples seeking a church wedding already have children, the couple might also be looking to have their children baptized. In most cases, the couple's wedding and the children's baptism will take place on separate occasions. This is to be preferred, as it allow for a series of sustained pastoral encounters with the family.

In the Church of England, Baptism is normally administered on Sundays at the best-attended act of public worship, so that the congregation may witness the newly-baptized being received into the Church (see Canon B 21).

If, however, a minister decides, for pastoral reasons, to combine marriage and baptism in a single act of worship, the order below suggests how this might be done. It draws on material from the Church of England's authorized Marriage and Baptism services from *Common Worship*.

In order to ensure that the baptism witnesses clearly to the reception of the newly-baptized into the Church, ministers should encourage a limited but substantial number of people from the local congregation to attend the celebration.

The suggested order assumes a situation in which the couple is already baptized. If this is not the case and the couple is seeking baptism, then the Liturgy of Baptism should precede the Marriage.

[If it is proposed to celebrate both Marriage and Baptism within a celebration of Holy Communion, the service should be planned with considerable care, with serious consideration being given to the overall length of the service, and the potential confusion arising from an overload in terms of imagery.]

It is crucial that all sections of the service (except those marked 'optional') are included and that, for items marked with an asterisk(*), an authorized text is used.
